### **Moving to New Block**

Our new building is almost complete and on Thursday morning we had the local kaumatua from Orakei Marae carry out a dawn blessing before we officially entered the building. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, only representatives from the Board, staff and builders attended.

This week we moved classroom furniture from Year 3, 4 and 5 classrooms into their new learning spaces and gave students from these classrooms a quick tour of their space. At the start of Term 4, students will go directly to these new learning spaces as teachers have already started to set them up ready for next term.

The teachers who are moving into the new teaching and learning space have worked with Lisa Horton and Jacque Allen since the beginning of this year in preparation for the move. Lisa is an architect who specialises in how educational spaces can be used effectively to enhance learning and Jacque works with teachers around designing collaborative teaching and learning programmes.

Based on the experience we have had with our current two story block and on the work we have carried out with Lisa and Jacque, we have set up each space to maximise teaching and learning. We will review and modify the layout as we progress through the year and in response to how effectively the layout is working.

In Term 4 we will hold open days for parents to visit the new learning spaces and gain an understanding of how we are planning to operate within it. We have postponed our official opening until Term 4 when all the work is complete and hopefully Covid-19 restrictions have eased.

We are excited to be able to bring our students into these teaching spaces and look forward to having parents and caregivers visit them in Term 4.


#### **Demolition of Rooms M 8,9,10,11.**

#### **Hero Parent Communication App**

As mentioned in our previous newsletter, we will be migrating our school systems to 'Hero', a school community communications app. The migration will happen over the holidays and we intend to begin using Hero to communicate important information and events with parents from the start of Term 4.

In 2021, the Hero system will be extended to include Real-Time Reporting on your child/children's academic progress. Hero will be a one-stop-shop for all communication which is something parents have asked for in recent surveys.

To prepare for this change, you can now install the Hero app on your mobile phone or other device. The app can be downloaded for both Apple and Android systems from the App Store or Play Store. **You will not be able to connect to your Hero account until our migration date of Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October.** After this date, we will be requesting that all parents set up their Hero accounts and being using this system for receiving communications (including newsletters) and reporting absences.

Once the system is set up, we will send out reminders and further instructions on how to use the app.

## **Spanish Club**

One of our amazing Teacher Aides – Doriana Degradi – has been running a Spanish Club, Thursday mornings before school, for our Spanish speaking students. As well as speaking Spanish, the club have been listening to Spanish music, doing some Spanish dancing and designing a logo for the club.
