## **Property Update**

During the Christmas break the builders completed the installation of retaining walls and seating outside the new block. This is a welcome addition to the new building and provides students a lovely space to sit during break times. The gates on the cricket nets were repaired and reinstated and are once again ready for our bowlers to practice. The old sandpit in the field was levelled out and filled and is now fenced off to allow the grass to grow. The area where the old classrooms were removed was grass seeded this area is fenced off until the grass grows again. The fencing around the artificial turf area was replaced and the learning through play area at the back of Room J13 and J14 was cleaned out ready for the year ahead.

## Ancient Egyptians Roam the Halls of St Thomas's School!



### **Student Medications**


If students require any medications to be administered during school time these medications must be held in the sickbay and administered by a first aid trained member of staff. Students should not have any medications in their school bags, apart from asthma inhalers if they are confident in using them.

All medications require parents to complete an Administering Medication in School form which can be picked up from the office. This is then sent to sickbay along with the medication.

## **Gate Opening Times**

The main gate, between the administration block and J1, will be opened at 8.15am each morning for students to enter. We would like parents/caregivers to say goodbye to their children at the gate in the mornings from Monday to Thursday. We will continue to have Whānau Friday for our community to come onto the school site. 
