

Principal's Message

Welcome back to Term 3 and one more winter month to go before spring arrives with the promise of better weather.

Recently I had the opportunity to spend time with other professionals in education looking at the impact of trauma on families and young people. Trauma may arise because of physical or emotional neglect or violence, poverty trauma, trauma from a medical event or loss of a loved one or other significant events in a child's life such as parental separation. Trauma in adults can overwhelm families to such an extent that the adults in the families may not have the spare capacity to meet the emotional needs of their children which leads to trauma in the child. Having significant and trusting adults in a child's life reduces the effects of trauma and teachers can play a significant part in this. School wide strategies such as our positive behaviour for learning programme and greeting children at the school gate in the morning creates a sense of safety and belonging which supports all children and especially those who have been impacted by trauma. As a school we will continue to learn about and put in place strategies which support us to be a trauma sensitive school to cater to the diverse needs of all our students.

549 Morning Bus Route

We have safety concerns for our students in the morning due to overcrowding on the 549 bus route. St Thomas's School has no control over the buses that bring our students to and from school, however we have had numerous correspondence and meetings with Auckland Transport to request a second bus on the morning 549 route. We have also contacted our local Orakei Board asking them to support our request.

The route 549 and route 550 buses both run in the afternoons. In the morning it is just the 549 route. Auckland Transport inform us that they have written a proposal to NZ Bus (the external operator) requesting that they provide an additional bus in the mornings, to cover the 550 route (from St Johns), from the start of next year. No date was provided as to when we might hear the outcome of this proposal. If

your child travels on the morning bus I would suggest you contact Auckland Transport to advocate for a
