The microscopes we used to make insects bigger when we saw them on the kawakawa leaves are cool - Year 3 Student



I think it was really cool learning about all of the different birds, how long they've been alive, and how many there are. I learnt a lot more about native birds than I would have thought! - Year 4 Student


